

**Andrew City Council Proceedings
May12th, 2026**

Mayor Roeder called the regular meeting of the Andrew City Council to order at 6:30 p.m. with council members Regan, Rowan, Till, Williams and Jamison present.

Reports:

Regan reported that he followed up on dogs running loose in town and spoke to a family member regarding the ordinance. Council discussed that it is within the city's rights to take any animal running loose to the Jackson County Humane Society. Don requested revisiting the Comelec contract and mentioned that the water shut off valve on the corner of Calhoun and Marion will be replaced this July with a joint effort from the city and county.

Jeff reported that hydrant flushing will be the last Thursday and Friday of the month starting this May and that there are two trees needing to be removed in the park.
Mayor Roeder reminded the council to bring information to the June meeting for the city newsletter.
